

# Older people's experiences of sight loss in care homes

This publication summarises findings from research commissioned by Thomas Pocklington Trust to investigate the experiences of older people with sight loss in care homes. The research was carried out by Dr Lizzie Ward and Laura Banks from the University of Brighton

## Summary findings

Older people with sight loss in care homes experience a range of challenges. These include difficulties with mobility, social isolation, and a loss of independence. Many people also experience a decline in their quality of life.

Older people with sight loss in care homes often feel that their needs are not being met. This can lead to feelings of frustration and helplessness. It is important that care homes provide a range of services to support older people with sight loss.
